For those of you who have time for only one business related book a month, the Richfield Branch Library has gone into the shelves to narrow down trending title suggestions.

The Signals Are Talking: Why Today's Frings is Tomorrow's Mainstream

By Amy Webb, founder of the Future Today Institute Public Affairs, 2016 ISBN-10: 978-1610396660

In her new book "The Signals Are Talking," author Amy Webb explores the difference between trendy and trends in today's economy. She states that "too often leaders ignore the signals of emerging trends, and wait too long to take actions" on them. She formulates a system of evaluating new ideas and interpreting events while explaining how to differentiate between significant ideas and "hip, shiny new objects" that won't persist as drivers of economic change.

Webb explores such current trends as artificial intelligence, machine learning, self-driving cars, bots, and the Internet of Things. She gives examples of successful companies that have listened to the signals



Scholarship committee chair – Jim Koewler, The Koewler Law Firm and adapted to the changes (Nintendo, founded in 1889), and those that haven't (Blackberry). She also claims that many of these trends can be predicted and that forecasting them is a learnable skill, which she lays out in a series of acronym heavy rules, concepts, and instructions.

I found Webb's examination of why some innovations succeed and others fail to be perceptive, and some of her predictions are fascinating. On the other hand, I found her discussion of trend prediction to be bordering on new age philosophy filled and with vague truisms about the fu-

ture. The book is very readable and does contain some good insights to help business owners navigate the future.
