In his new book Chaos Monkeys, Antonio Garcia Martinez gives a behind the scenes account of the world of venture capitalism. The author started his career as a Ph.D. student in physics at Berkeley before joining Goldman Sachs to model prices for credit derivatives. After a short stint as CEO of his own startup, Garcia Martinez joined Facebook's budding advertising team, turning its users' data into profit for COO Sheryl Sandberg and chairman and CEO Mark Zuckerberg. Forced out in the wake of an internal product war over the future of the company's strategy, García Martínez landed at rival Twitter, eventually cashing out and moving to a 40-foot yacht anchored in San Francisco harbor.



The book is a hilarious and sometimes raunchy description of Silicon Valley, in which he describes the trade secrets of the various visionaries, opportunists and money cowboys who are reshaping the world of technology. Garcia Martinez summarizes his view of the tech industry in four basic observations: "Inves-

tors are people with more money than time. Employees are people with more time than money. Entrepreneurs are the



seductive go-between. Marketing is like sex: only losers pay for it." Although I think most readers will be primarily fascinated with the celebrity caricatures of Silicon Valley elites as well as tales of his personal debaucheries, the author does make many insightful observations about the workings of the industry that are shaping our

current economy.
