## **Let's Stop Meeting Like This**

by Dick and Emily Axelrod, c. 2014 Berrett-Koehler Publishers. ISBN 9781626560819 \$19.95

Imagine if you made your meetings voluntary, would anyone come? Would anyone stay?

I can think of nothing more frus-

trating than attending pointless, time-wasting meetings. And due to many requests to find a book about running a meeting, it seems like lots of you feel the same way. There are two types of bad meetings. There are the good, productive and inspiring ones, but they fail to provide closure. They end

abruptly leaving you hanging. You are not sure who will lead the ideas, or do the projects. Even worse, you receive no updates on the end product! The other type is most typical, the "this could have all been done by email" kind of

meeting. These meetings can be too passive, too unorganized, too false in its pretense that what you had to say actually mattered, or

all of the above. What a waste!

I was attracted to the title of this month's review, because it sums up our problem nicely, doesn't it? This book can be used to conduct Town Hall sessions to PTA meetings. Now I will say that the concept presented here was hokey, using an analogy of a canoe and

a "talking" time clock. However, the attractive points of this book are: the chapters are short, unnecessary babble is eliminated; the key points are just that, key, and concise. The key points are recapped at the end of each chap-



ter, and I can remember them (or quickly and easily find them). It is a book you will thumb through often.
