#### **Lean In:**


#### Women, Work, and the Will to Lead

by Sheryl Sandberg. c. 2013 Alfred A . Knopf. ISBN 9780385349949 \$24.95

I was intimidated to read this for several reasons: mainly because it is career advice from the very successful COO of Facebook. Surely, I judged, she's the type that eats people like me for breakfast. I assumed she would point out all of "my" shortcomings of not living up to the feminist movement to dominate a "Man's World."

On the contrary, this is a book that I want my daughters to read when they become a bit older. If you are a woman in the work force, or thinking of coming back into the work force; or if you are a dad with daughters or granddaughters, or with nieces etc, and you, of course, want their best interests at heart, I encourage you to read this book. Here's 3 selected conflicts Sandberg challenges women to ask and face:

First, why am I in this conference room feeling compelled to serve the coffee or hang out like a wallflower instead of sitting at the table and



pitching in on the meeting? I was invited, I'm on payroll, so pull up a chair and lean in!

Second, why am I expecting the

corner office to wait for when I feel ready? If the itch of aspiration arises, grab!

Third, why am I working 40 hours and wondering why the laundry isn't done? If I want the laundry to get done, and the re-write of the credit policy finished, then this house needs a staff of 2. Get it?

I want my daughters to know that they can have a career and kids too. They should go after their dreams of being a COO or Director, or Chief of the Household, or whatever they wish.




