
For those of you who have time for only one business related book a month, the Richfield Branch Library has gone into the shelves to narrow down trending title suggestions.

The Smartest Places on Earth: Why Rustbelts Are the Emerging Hotspots of Global Innovation

By Antoine Van Agtmael and Fred Bakker. Public Affairs Publishing, 2016. ISBN: 9781610364352 \$25.99

You won't read about Detroit, Chicago or Cleveland. Or Silicon Valley, for that matter, and how if we just "plug in" to all the wondrous things they're doing, it will all be fixed here. You will read uplifting stories about Rustbelt cities around the globe that are responding to the new economy and making a profound comeback – like Akron.

In the old economy, the focus was on making things as cheap as possible.



But in this new economy, the goal is to make things as smart as possible.

Smart innovation and manufacturing cannot use cheap labor. In order to make smart things, you need smart and skilled em-

ployees. The recipe for success requires several key pieces and a willingness to bring the city back.

You need to have businesses like Goodyear as well as bustling start-ups. You need trade schools and academies like Akron University to train employees for the smart economy. You need

funders and grant support from local and state government. Finally, you need a leader or two who have the foresight to make connections and secure the right players. Not every Rustbelt city is making a comeback, but Akron is.

"One of our most striking experiences took place in Akron, Ohio, on that first foray into the American Rustbelt," reads page 93. Find out why Akron was mentioned in this book 20 times and took up an inch and a half of index space with nine sub-categories. Read why living and working so close to Akron puts you in great shape. Richfield Historical Society explores local history with 'TakeMeBack' series

The May 12 Richfield Historical Society TakeMeBack series presentation, "Jim Smith, Prisoner of the Ohio Indians," will be held at 7 p.m. at the Historical Museum of Richfield, 3907 Broadview Road.

Presenter John Burke will portray Jim Smith, who was captured by Indians at British General Edward Braddock's defeat during the French and Indian War in 1755. Smith was the first white man to see Medina County, where he wintered at Panther Cave, now known as Whipps Ledges in Hinckley. Through the journal Smith kept, attendees will learn about his capture and adoption as an Indian.
