The Curse of Cash


By Kenneth S. Rogoff, Thomas D Cabot Professor of Public Policy at Harvard University Princeton University Press, 2016 ISBN-10: 0691172137

In his new book, Kenneth S. Rogoff makes a compelling case for the transition away from nearly all cash transactions. There is a lot of cash in our economy, in fact almost \$4,200.00 for every citizen of The United States. Over 80% of that cash is in \$100.00 bills. What's in your wallet, indeed! Probably not too much in \$100's. If you are shocked to hear that we are still

a cash-heavy society, you're probably curious to know who has all this cash and what are they doing with it.

According to Rogoff, a large part is feeding tax evasion, corruption, terrorism, the drug trade, human trafficking, and

other parts of the underground economy! The IRS estimates that it loses hundreds of billions of dollars from individuals and businesses hiding their receipts and not paying into Social Security. He also explains that paper money can also cripple




monetary policy. Further, Rogoff states that central banks have been unable to stimulate growth and inflation by cutting interest rates significantly below zero for fear that it would drive investors to abandon treasury bills and stockpile cash.

In order to change this, Rogoff has proposed slowly phasing out paper currency starting with the highest denominations, leaving bills no larger than \$10.00. The idea of going cashless seems at first to be a radical idea, but think about how much less cash you use now than 10 years ago. Maybe he's on to something.
