A regional economic powerhouse will speak at Chamber banquet

The Greater Cleveland Sports Commission is one of the largest economic drivers for Cleveland and Northeast Ohio

This winter they are bringing to the Cleveland area the Big Ten Indoor Men's and Women's Track and Field Championships at the Spire Institute in Geneva and the Rock 'N Rumble Junior Volleyball tournaments at the Huntington Convention Center. 
