

# The Coming Jobs War: What Every Leader Must Know About the Future of Job Creation

Adding fuel to the already charged environment this month, I look at this review of The Coming Jobs War as a call to action for the Richfield Chamber group. While The Coming Jobs War speaks more to the mission of the Chamber than for an individual

company or business owner, it will stir the leader in you take note.

Jim Clifton argues that everyone around the globe seeks a "good job". What is a "good job"? It is a knowledge job (one feels useful and a contributor to something) that is steady, reliable and a guaranteed- 30 hours-or- more work week. A "good job" defines your relationship with your city, country and world. Everything is tied to good jobs. Lack of "good jobs" creates a frightening spiral-like strain on your community's resources, energy and future outlook. Joblessness, low graduation rates, and poor workplace energy/outputs are all blemishes on the community.

Mr. Clifton urges business leaders to stand up, tap into your talents and help guide your community to offer, or create, or inspire, or guide, or design "good job" opportunities. Here, Richfield Chamber, is your calling. Chamber groups care that their city "win", that their city "looks good "is "attractive" and "desirable" to entrepreneurs. Strong Chamber groups are excellent mentors, and can be a beacon, making way for other "good job" companies to settle here. The city, in essence, becomes healthier. Look to what makes Palo Alto, for example, a successful city over so many others that are not. I've been to a few Richfield Chamber meetings, and the qualities above are transparent in this group.

The Coming Jobs War addresses many other headline issues. It is a fascinating, frightening but inspiring, electrically charged, get-back-in-that-ring-America, read.
