At some point, if you haven't already, you will be called to give a presentation. It could be a formal "call to action" in front of hundreds, or it could be a persuasive speech in front of five. Recently, I had to give a persuasive talk in front of 15 of my peers, and I wish I had Nancy Duarte's Resonate before I did so. Here's why:



to Duarte's pointers. I wish I'd thought to deliver the content with the purpose of transforming my coworkers world from what is to what could be. I wish I'd found the storyline pulse that creates a momentum of emotion and energy, much like how a sailboat weaves to catch the wind that propels it forward.
