
BUSINESS BOOKS

Applied Empathy: The New Language of Leadership

In his new book Applied Empathy, author Michael Ventura, the founder and CEO of the business consultancy Sub Rosa, lays out a methodology that brings together insight and action, resulting in creative problem solving for businesses in any field. Empathy, according to Ventura, who has consulted with brands ranging from Google to Nike to The United Nations, is not about being nice - it's about understanding your customers, your colleagues, and your company. By adopting his method, businesses can lay the



groundwork to establish a more innovative, diverse, and motivated team to meet the challenges of today's marketplace.

Unlike many of the books written about leadership in business, this book is anything but dry

and factual. He explains his ideas with witty anecdotes and presents practical activities and goals in each chapter and his passion for these ideas comes through clearly. As he says in the introduction, "I wanted to communicate something I really care about at a time in the world when empathy is needed.""
