Our November Speaker

Sam Petros, CEO, Petros Homes, Inc.

Born in 1957 and raised on the Westside of Cleveland and a graduate of

After founding Petros Homes, Inc. in 1985 Sam began to exercise his passion for land development and started to build homes in the suburbs of North Royalton, Brecksville, Broadview Heights, Hinckley, Richfield, Westlake and Seven Hills. The company has grown to over \$45 million in annual sales and has an established a reputation for creating well-built and wellplanned communities. He has gained respect as a leader in an industry that provides the American dream.


